



Scholarship Opportunity: Become a Certified Intervener

Make a profound difference in the life of a student with deafblindness. The **Kansas Deaf-Blind Project (KSDBP)** is offering a scholarship to help you earn your Intervener national credentials and provide specialized support to students who are deafblind.

What is a Certified Intervener?

A Certified Intervener is a specialized paraprofessional trained to provide consistent sensory access to students who are deafblind. Through this online program, you will:

- Receive specialized training in deafblindness.
- Earn a **Certificate of Completion**.
- Become eligible for the **National Intervener Credential** via the National Resource Center for Paraeducators.

Scholarship Eligibility

To qualify for this funding opportunity, applicants must:

- Be currently working with a student on the **Kansas Deaf-Blind Registry**.
- Have the support of a school district willing to cover initial costs, or be prepared to self-fund tuition and books until reimbursement is made.

How the Funding Works

The Kansas Deaf-Blind Project operates on a **reimbursement basis**:

1. The school district or individual pays for tuition and textbooks.
2. The student completes the course successfully.
3. The KSDBP reimburses the district for all approved costs upon receipt of proof of payment and completion.

Funding is provided by the Kansas State Department of Education through the Kansas Deaf-Blind Project.
